Susan Evans will take care of the weekly KP. The holes included are 4, 8 (in two), and 12. The cost is \$.25 each hole.

Thursday Evening Ladies' Golf will now cost \$10.00 to join the game. The number of prizes is increasing, and the cost of prizes is rising. A 50/50 component is included in the \$10.00 fee. If a player has no handicap, the club is proposing the player declare a handicap of 32. The pro shop offered to track scores and to help people calculate handicaps.

Zone 1 Ladies' Championship will take place June 4 and 5 at Castlegar. Linda asked for volunteers and suggestions for a theme. It will be held the same weekend as Castlegar Sunfest. Usually there are about 50 participants.

He will offer Friday night couples' lessons and custom lessons for groups of four as well as other individually tailored lessons. Junior lessons have started and are filling up quickly.

Calcium chloride will be applied around the cart shed in order to keep the dust down.

The pond is getting sludgy, but it would cost \$20,000.00 to remove the sludge.

Mark Lloyd gave an update on the tee box repairs. Many of the tees are starting to get bumps and clumps.

#13 forward tee is in the process of being repaired. It has been aerated and pressed down and will be top dressed with sand.

#14 forward tee needs repairs. It may be moved toward the centre of the fairway. The work will most likely occur in the fall.
